

## 02 Chashitsu in Residence



The top floor of the building, which is a 3-minute walk from the station in Tokyo and has good access, has been completely renovated into a traditional japanese house with japanese tea room(Chashitsu).

Natural squeezed logs are used for the floor pillars of the eight tatami mat hall, and 2500-year-old cedar is used for the base and top plates of the side floors. In addition, avoiding the beams of the structure and using nets and decorative rafters to create a descending ceiling. The roof balcony has an open field that is lightweight and has measures against wind.


